Contract 9565 is for the pubic improvements required for the development of 4725 Hill Farms place by Madison Yards Lodging Associates, LLC. Improvements include construction of 8-foot wide sidewalk on Sheboygan Avenue with incidental terrace, curb, and pavement work as needed. A new ramp and marked mid-block pedestrian crosswalk is to be constructed at Iron Street (private street) across Sheboygan Avenue to the existing ramp on the south side of Sheboygan Avenue. This project will re-grade an existing pond and greenways in the Old Sauk Trails Business Park to maximize flood conveyance and storage and increase the size of the culverts on Deming Way (north), Fourier Drive, and Deming Way (southwest), as well as improve conveyance out of an enclosed depression on Blackhawk Rd and Deming Way. The project will restore the project area with native vegetation. The total estimated cost

of the project is \$9,699,200.

This Change Order consists of three Change Order Requests totaling \$141,002.86. (1) \$56,109.38 is for labor and materials costs for 4 electricians to pull 8 sets, each 60 feet long, of 4-conductor #600 wire between the new 4,000 amp service CT cabinet and switchboard. This scope of work was not included in the bid documents and also excluded by Madison Gas and Electric. (2) \$25,261.88 is for work associated with Construction Bulletin 6 which included site-civil changes related to the fuel tank and electric bus pantograph charger. (3) \$59,631.60 is for work associated with Construction Bulletin 7 which included relocation of the fire pump room for the maintenance building to significantly reduce costs that would have been assessed to the project by MGE due to long wire runs. Up to and including this change order (#13) a total of \$687,109.03 contingency has been utilized, which is ~53% of the total authorized contingency available for this project (\$1,287,977).
